Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Van Duzen River watershed, approximately 4 miles southeast of the town of Dinsmore, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 23, T1N, R5E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Dinsmore U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 210-117-012; latitude 40.4398 N and longitude 123.5787 W.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number EPIMS-HUM-23964-R1C, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Rumen Ivanov.

The project is limited to three encroachments. One encroachment is for removal of water diversion infrastructure and associated debris from unnamed tributaries to the Van Duzen River.
