Title: PG&E Replacement of Distribution Feeder Main 0630 (DFM-0630/R-1385) Across the Sacramento River

Proponent: Pacific Gas and Electric

Location: Immediately west of the town of Meridian and extending west across the Sacramento River into Colusa County, Colusa and Sutter Counties

Description: The Project would install a new 4-inch-diameter pipeline underneath the Sacramento River using horizontal directional drilling (HDD) techniques, tie the new crossing into the existing pipeline network, and then decommission the existing Sacramento River crossing. The Project would be conducted in two distinct but sequential phases: 1) replacement pipeline installation and 2) decommissioning of the existing DFM-0630 pipeline crossing.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above described project on August 23, 2022, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) was prepared for this project pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
