The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), using state funding only, is proposing to restore the roadway to a condition that requires minimal maintenance. The project will apply a 0.10' overlay of Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) over approximately 6 miles of SR 96 in Siskiyou County (PM 97.0/103.0). Continued on page 3.

All work will be confined within the existing roadbed hinge point. Removal of thermoplastic pavement markings and cold planing of existing surface will be required to match existing features. No overlay work will be performed on bridge decks. Shoulder backing will be placed on existing shoulders to bring shoulders up to the new asphalt level. Guardrail will be upgraded as needed and new guardrail will be installed on both sides of SR 96 at the box culvert located at PM 102.29.

Purpose: The purpose of the project is to provide efficient, easily maintained pavement that provides minimum maintenance for multiple years, as well as increase safety for travelers and workers.

Need: The existing roadway is in a poor condition with localized areas of severe distress. Routine maintenance has not been sufficient to maintain an adequate road surface.

Right-of-Way

Acquisitions or TCEs will not be needed for this project due to work being confined to ROW.

Staging/Stockpiling

Multiple locations are available for staging/stockpiling use. No grading and/or site preparation will occur. Approved staging locations include: PM 97.75 EB, PM 98.14 WB, PM 99.08 EB, PM 99.27 WB, PM 99.5 WB, PM 100.41 WB, PM 100.5 WB, PM 101.52 WB, PM 101.55 EB, PM 102.08 EB, PM 102.25 EB, PM 102.5 EB.

Disposal/Borrow Sites

The project would not utilize borrowed material. Excess material will become the property of the contractor.

Biological Resources

To identify potential biological resources, Caltrans staff conducted a review of internal and external agency resource records and databases.

Prior to installing the new guardrail, a silt fence will be temporarily placed along the headwall at PM 102.29. This BMP will be necessary to prevent construction and road shoulder material from spilling over the culvert headwall and entering State and Federal waters.

Coordination/Consultation

Caltrans has performed an environmental evaluation consisting of a review of resource records and databases, consultation, and coordination with applicable agencies and individuals.
