The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes a project to rehabilitate deteriorated and damaged portion of the existing roadway drainage system on State Route 162 (SR-162) at post miles (PM) 20.7 – 23.3 in Butte County, due to corrosion deteriorating the culvert walls, inverts and inlets structures. This project is needed to extend the drainage system service life and prevent further degradation of the culverts.

Scope of work:

The project proposes to rehabilitate deteriorated components of the roadway drainage system on State Route 162 (SR-162) at post miles (PM) 20.7 – 23.3 in Butte County, due to corrosion deteriorating the culvert walls, inverts and inlets structures.

Staging
