



Notice of Intent to Adopt a Negative Declaration Study Results Available Changes Proposed for U.S. Route 395 in Inyo County Opportunity for Public Hearing

What's Being Planned:

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is considering the "Golf Course Two-Way Left Turn Lane I" project, which proposes to widen the pavement and upgrade other facilities in order to construct a two way left turn lane on U.S. Route 395, from postmiles 114.00 to 114.90, near the city of Bishop in Inyo County.



Why This Ad: Caltrans has studied the effects this project may have on the environment. Our studies show it will not significantly affect the quality of the environment. The report that explains why is called an Initial Study, Proposed Negative Declaration. This notice is to tell you of the preparation of the document, its availability for you to read and offer comments, and to notify you that the opportunity exists for an online public information meeting should multiple members of the public request one.
