The proposed program is a Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) Exchange Program (program) – a voluntary program in which discretionary development applicants can participate to reduce the amount of VMT generated by their projects. The program will also provide applicants with the option to reduce potentially significant VMT impacts identified through the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review process by constructing specified VMT-reducing projects that have been identified by the City. The program will provide applicants with the option to implement early action exchange program projects, which include pedestrian network, bicycle network, and transit supportive improvements that are located within existing developed rights of way in Escondido city limits.
