Install a flood protection berm, flood gate, warning system and barrier arms, and pier and lagging retaining wall, modify the existing stormwater system, and modify Llano Road along the Laguna Treatment Plant frontage. Improvements would occur within the LTP site, with some ancillary improvements occurring along Llano Road.
