The Project is centered at a latitude/longitude: 37.710, -121.554. **Project Description:** This proposed project involves the development of a 400-megawatt capacity solar energy generation and storage facility and the facility's subsequent operation. Major Project components are the solar facility, the battery energy storage system, access roads, and a 230-kilovolt gen-tie, which will include both above ground and underground components. The Project will result in impacts to 44.94 acres of habitat for Crotch's bumble bee (Bombus crotchii), California tiger salamander (Ambystoma californiense), and San Joaquin kit fox (Vulpes macrotis mutica), collectively; including temporary impacts to 22.10 acres; and 22.84 acres of permanent impacts. The Project is expected to result in incidental take of California tiger salamander and San Joaquin kit fox, which are designated as Threatened species under CESA, and Crotch's bumble bee, which is designated as a Candidate species under CESA. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species that are listed or designated as candidates for listing under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation within the scope of the ITP's Covered Activities, subject to the limitations and Conditions of Approval in the ITP.
