<u>Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:</u>

Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) will replace telemetry equipment at fifty-one potable water and sanitation sites within the cities of Palm Desert, Cathedral City, La Quinta, Rancho Mirage, Indio, Thermal, Indian Wells, Desert Hot Springs, and North Shore. The sites facilities include Domestic Wells (W) and Sanitary Lift Stations (LS):

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The purpose of the project is to rehabilitate and improve the reliability of domestic water and sanitary services. CVWD's domestic water and sewer collection system are comprised of 169 remote sites, including well sites, booster stations, and reservoirs; as well as 28 sanitary lift stations throughout the Coachella Valley. These sites have a mix of legacy remote terminal units (mRTU) that are beyond their useful life, antiquated, and replacement parts are difficult to find. The replacement of this equipment with updated Programmatic Logic Controls (PLC) technology will provide for significant operational optimization through streamlined communications with our newly implemented SCADA system. CVWD is also participating in a Demand Response Program (DRP) with Enersponse through Southern California Edison.

Construction will consist of the removal and proper disposal of the existing electronic equipment. Fifty-one new electronic PLCs will be installed, hard-wired, and tested for operation. E-waste will be disposed of utilizing CVWD's contracted services for disposal at an authorized recycling facility. Negligible downtime is anticipated for the facility installation, and will not impact CVWD domestic water and sanitary services. CVWD will replace equipment for fifty-one sites over the next two-year period.

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Surrounding land uses consist of residential, commercial, recreational, and roadways. The project is not located within or adjacent to a conservation area associated with the Coachella Valley Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan. The project sites are located within developed urban areas, paved roadways, or parking lots, and involve negligible ground disturbance.

Reasons why project is exempt:

State CEQA Guidelines §15301 (Existing Facilities) allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The project includes the rehabilitation of 51 telemetry units and CVWD potable water and sanitation facilities, which does not pose the possibility of a significant effect on the environment. The replacement equipment would be located on the same site and have substantially the same use as the existing equipment.

State CEQA Guidelines §15032 (Replacement or Reconstruction) allows for projects consisting of the replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced. The replacement telemetry equipment would be located on the same site and have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the existing equipment.
