Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Sierra Nevada Conservancy would provide funding for the Pit Resource
Conservation District to partner with Modoc National Forest (MNF) to improve forest
resilience by increasing spatial and age-class heterogeneity within and among lodgepole
pine-dominated stands. Most of the lodgepole pine stands within the Project are overly
dense and highly susceptible to mountain pine beetle (MPB). The overall Project goal is
to reduce the likelihood of a widespread MPB outbreak and tree mortality that could lead
to a stand-replacing fire. The Project will mechanically thin approximately 4,100 acres.
Within these acres of thinning, fuelbreaks will be developed on approximately 350 acres,
and surface fuels will be reduced on approximately 200 acres. The Project will protect the
entire Medicine Lake caldera, a culturally important landscape to the Pit River Tribes,
Klamath Tribes and Modoc Nation, as well as Forest Service recreational infrastructure.
