Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

LRCCD is proposing to construct Beach Volleyball Facilities located in the recreational part of the CRC campus. The proposed Beach Volleyball Facilities Project consists of the construction of six (6) beach volleyball courts. Each court would be constructed with sand up to 18 inches in depth with individual drainage systems consisting of 6-inch diameter perforated drainpipe, angular drain rock, and geotextile non-woven fabric. Other proposed plans include installation of chain link fencing around the perimeter of the beach volleyball court facilities, the removal of 12 trees, sport lighting, concrete hard scape, additional landscaping, an official's tent, referee stands, and a lockable electrical pedestal for a PA system.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The Project does not have the potential to substantially reduce habitat of a fish or wildlife species, cause a fish or wildlife population to drop below self-sustaining levels, eliminate a plant or animal community, reduce the number or restrict the range of a rare or endangered plant or animal or eliminate important examples of the major periods of California history or prehistory. Mitigation Measures included to address potential impacts to Swainson's hawk, nesting migratory birds, and potential impacts to cultural resources are reduced to less than significant levels.

With mitigation measures incorporated, the project would not be expected to result in any new environmental effects, such as significant increases in GHG emissions, exposure to hazards or hazardous materials, or exposure to excessive noise levels, which would cause adverse effects on human beings. Because adverse effects on human beings, either directly or indirectly, would not occur as a result of implementation of the proposed project, less-than-significant impacts with mitigations incorporated would result.
