

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration

Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 21092 and CEQA Guidelines Section 15072

PROJECT TITLE: Roseton Plant New Tank and Booster Station Project (Project)

APPLICANT: Golden State Water Company (GSWC) – Artesia, 1910004 (Applicant)

LEAD AGENCY: State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board)

PROJECT LOCATION: 17456 Roseton Avenue, Artesia, CA, 90701. Los Angeles County.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: GSWC – Artesia proposes the construction of a 750,000-gallon above-ground potable water storage tank, booster pump station, stationary emergency generator, associated fencing, lighting, control panels, and appurtenances at the Roseton Well site. The Proposed Project would also relocate the existing backwash tank and motor control center. Existing plant site piping would be modified, as needed. The Project also includes the removal of ornamental trees along the western fence line. The Project would increase storage to help provide potable water to the Artesia System and address the existing storage deficiency, add redundancy to the existing system, and maintain an uninterrupted supply of water for the system. The overall capacity required by the Artesia System would be the same as existing conditions, therefore there would be no capacity increase with the Proposed Project.
