Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The purpose of the project is to improve fish passage conditions for adult and juvenile salmonids and Pacific lamprey in Dye Creek. Improving fish passage at this site will improve access for anadromous fish to at least ten miles of spawning, rearing, and holding stream habitat upstream of the project site, and will improve downstream fish passage conditions during outmigration.

Exempt Status:

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region has determined that the Project is exempt from review under CEQA pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15333, Small Habitat Restoration Projects. Class 33 consists of projects not to exceed five acres in size to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of habitat for fish, plants, or wildlife provided that (a) there would be no significant adverse impact on endangered, rare or threatened species or their habitat pursuant to section 15065; (b) there are no hazardous materials at or around the project site that may be disturbed or removed; and (c) the project will not result in impacts that are significant when viewed in connection with the effects of past projects, the effects of other current projects, and the effects of probable future projects.

Reasons why Project is Exempt:

This project is Categorically Exempt under CEQA section 15333 because the project's sole purpose is habitat restoration and is less than 5 acres in size.
