#### NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

**Description of nature and purpose of the Project:** The project proposes to reduce fuel loading and provide training opportunities for local and state fire agencies. A secondary objective is to reduce populations of invasive thistle (*Centaurea spp.*) to enhance grazing. To achieve these objectives the project proponent proposes to use broadcast burning within the project boundaries, which encompass 964 acres. Control lines are expected to primarily be wet lines created by fire engines. Heavy equipment will be restricted to existing roads and disc lines maintained by the ranch owners. Additional handline construction may be necessary in places; this is expected to be minimal. All burning will be performed in accordance with the terms and conditions of a burn permit issued by the Colusa Air Pollution Control District. Annual burns at this location are anticipated.

A 25-foot buffer will be placed on all watercourses and wetlands within the project area. Within this buffer:

- No vehicles or equipment are permitted except on existing roads.
- No handlines are to be constructed.
- No ignition devices are to be used.

Work may occur during nesting bird season. If work commences during nesting bird season (February 1<sup>st</sup> to September 15<sup>th</sup>) the project area will be surveyed for nesting birds no more than one month prior to operations by a qualified biologist. If nesting birds are located, the Yolo Resource Conservation District will develop measures that minimize impacts and is consistent with the Migratory Bird Treaty Act.

The biological report used to develop this NOE was prepared for the Janus Solar Project, which is located at the same site as the proposed project. The results of the biological report show that no significant environmental

impacts would result from the Janus Solar project, a project with similar, minor levels of disturbance as the proposed broadcast burn. Additionally, the biological report identifies a somewhat significant population of Parry's rough tarplant (*Centromadia parryi* ssp. *rudis*), an unlisted endemic species that is often found growing in disturbed soils. Prescribed burning with a low to moderate intensity results in levels of disturbance that are beneficial to California native ecosystems. The proposed project would result in minor soil disturbance that is likely to improve the habitat for Parry's rough tarplant populations.

Project implementation will result in alterations to the land that are best described as minor in scope, that will not significantly impact the aesthetic of the property, or biological and/or cultural resources, and that do not involve the removal of mature, scenic trees for any purpose. No exceptions apply which would preclude the use of a "Notice of Exemption" for this project. It has been concluded that no significant adverse environmental impacts would occur to aesthetics, agriculture and forest resources, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, energy, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use and planning, mineral resources, noise, populations and housing, public services, recreation, transportation and traffic, utilities and service systems, or wildfire. 
