Project Location: The project is located at the Truckee River, in the County of Nevada, State of California; Latitude 39.438053, Longitude -120.020684; Near a large pullout on eastbound Interstate 80 roughly 1.4 miles east of the Farad exit; Assessor's Parcel Number: 048-040-002-000.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification Number NEV-30686-R2, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, California Trout.

The project is limited to the stabilization of the steep and eroding bank of the Truckee River with a series of small terraces comprised of logs and boulders and backfilled with native material generated from onsite. Each terrace will include between four to six 2-foot diameter (1/2-ton) boulders and the bottom step along the edge of water will having four 3-foot diameter (1-ton) boulders. The side slopes will be graded between 2:1 and 3:1. Side slopes will be revegetated with willow pole plantings and a native seed mix.
