The project is located at 8349 El Verano Avenue. The site is approximately 2,550 feet north of Elverta Road and approximately 1,230 feet south of Adair Street in the Elverta community.

Description of Project:

The project consists of the construction of a 40x64 (2,560 square feet) metal barn. The barn has been located such that there would not be any impacts to environmental resources.

Exempt Status:

Categorical Exemption (PRC Section 21084; CEQA Guidelines Sections 15300 -15333):

 CEQA Guidelines Section 15303 – New Construction of Conversion of Small Structures

Reasons why project is exempt:

Class 3 consists of the construction and location of limited numbers of small facilities or structures. The project would construct a single metal barn consistent with the provisions of Class 3 and is therefore exempt from the provisions of CEQA.

Section 15300.2-Exceptions

Section 15300.2 of the CEQA Guidelines, Exceptions, provides conditions under which categorical exemptions are inapplicable. Review of the Project indicates that it will not violate any of the exceptions, as described in the following section.

1. The project will occur in certain specified sensitive environments or locations;

The Project site has not been deemed an environmentally sensitive location. The proposed barn has been sited on the property such that is will avoid all trees on the project site, as well as waterways and water features within the vicinity of the property.

2. Cumulative impacts will be considerable because successive projects of the same type will occur at the same place overtime;

The Project will not result in cumulative environmental impacts.

3. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances:

There are no known unusual circumstances that will have a significant effect on the environment.

4. The project may result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources within a highway officially designated as a scenic highway;

The Project is not located in the vicinity of a highway officially designated as a scenic highway. The closest state designated scenic highway is SR160/River Road, which is more than 10 miles to the southwest. Therefore, the project will not result in damage to scenic resources or similar resources within a highway that is officially designated as a scenic highway.

5. The project is located on a site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; or

The Project site is not included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code. Therefore, the Project will not have an impact related to being located on a hazardous waste site.

6. The project may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historic resource.

The project site does not contain any historical resources. Therefore, the project would not result in an adverse change in the significance of a historic resource.
