Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:				
The Ventura County Transportation Commission's (VCTC) Santa Paula Branch Line (SPBL) Rail Bridge (Mile Post 423.44) over Sespe Creek Overflow was damaged by the catastrophic storms during the winter of 2022-2023. The bridge is located in unincorporated Ventura County west of the City of Filmore, Ventura County. The bridge was constructed in 1969 with 15 spans spaced 29.83-feet apart for a total bridge length of 450-feet.				
On January 10, 2023, following a series of large storms that produced extreme sediment and debris ladened flows, three span bents were washed out on the western end of the bridge. The rail and attached rail ties were left suspended between the abutment and the 4th bent, leaving this line out of service. The Governor of the State of California declared a State of Emergency on January 4, 2023 related to the severe winter storms and subsequent				
flooding and damage (CDA 23-001). On January 14, 2023, the President of the United States issued a disaster declaration for the California Severe Winter Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides (DR-4683-CA). VCTC has requested Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funding to compensate for the structure repair. All work to be performed in compliance with Metrolink engineering standards, as applicable.
