The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to conduct bridge maintenance work on seven (7) bridges on State Route 120 in San Joaquin and Stanislaus County. General scope of work is listed in the Continuation Sheet. All work will be within Caltrans Right of Way. The purpose of this project is to extend the service life of the bridges. The project is needed to prevent future costly rehabilitation or replacement of the bridges.

The scope of work consists of removing and replacing unsound concrete in deck, placing polyester concrete overlay on the bridge deck, installing approach slabs, treating the bridge decks with methacrylate, and replacing joint seals. The following work is proposed at each bridge:

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General:

- Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact the Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.
- Contact the Environmental Office to attend the pre-construction meeting.

Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 1. Stop all work within a 60-foot radius of discovery
 2. Protect the discovery area
 3. Notify the Engineer
 4. The Department Investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Hazardous Waste:

- Caltrans Standard Special Provision pertaining to Earth Material Containing Lead 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) will be implemented. A lead compliance plan is required, and all soil must be redistributed on site.
- An approved Caltrans Non-Standard Special Provision (NSSP) 14-11.16 and 14-9.02 will be implemented for asbestos containing material.
- Caltrans Standard Specification 14-11.12 will be implemented for selective grinding removal of unknown age of yellow thermoplastic and painted stripes and pavement markings.

Biological Resource:

The following avoidance and minimization measure will be implemented:

- If construction will occur during migratory bird season (February 1 – September 30), a pre-construction bird survey will be required at locations 2-7 on State



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Route 120. If an active bird nest is observed, a 100-foot buffer will be established around the nest until the young have fledged. Caltrans Standard Special Provision 14-6.03A will be added to the construction contract to request a 300-foot buffer be established around any active hawk nest that is observed. A 600-foot buffer would be established for Swainson's Hawk. Contractors must submit a request to the Caltrans District 10 Environmental Office to have a qualified Caltrans biologist conduct a nesting bird survey within 14 days prior to the start of any construction related activities. Construction activities will not begin until authorized. If approved, construction related activities must commence within 14 days of a location's nesting bird survey completion. If the contractors fail to commence the construction related activities within 14 days, or if there is a halt to the activities with a delay of more than 14 days, another nesting bird survey must be performed by the Caltrans qualified biologist. Construction cannot recommence until authorized.
