PROJECT TITLE: Pecho Valley Emergency Road Repair

LOCATION: Montaña de Oro State Park

COUNTY: San Luis Obispo County

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Conduct emergency work to repair a landslide on Pecho Valley Road at Spooner’s Cove in Montaña de Oro State Park. The project entails the following work:

- Remove vegetation and loose surficial soils down to competent undisturbed formational material estimated to be approximately 4 to 8 feet below the slope surface.
- Cut horizontal benches angled slightly into the slope be into competent undisturbed soil roughly parallel slope contours. Benches will be at least 8 feet wide and approximately 4 feet high.
- Install a permanent subdrainage system consisting of 4-inch perforated pipe at the back of each bench bedded and backfilled with open-graded crushed rock wrapped in geotextile filter fabric.
- Place engineered fill in compacted 8-inch lifts with geotextile fabric every 4 feet intervals.
- Install permanent erosion control measures including hydroseeding on the reconstructed and adjacent slope areas.
- Regrade areas above the slope failure area and adjacent slope to drain away from the slope to prevent the occurrence of ponding at the top of the slope or “run-on” water flowing over and down the slope.
- Install an asphalt curb along the roadway edge at the top of the slope to minimize roadway runoff to flow onto the repair area.
- Repave road using a minimum 3-inches of pavement over 10-inches of aggregate base rock.


