Project Title: I-15 Mojave Wildlife Overcrossings (Project)

**Project Location San Bernardino County:** The Project is located on approximately 20.5 acres of publicly owned property at three locations along I-15, Cady Mountain (PM R116.70; 35.088, -116.322), Zzyzx Road (PM R129.75; 35.195, -116.142), and Clark Mountain (PM 168.05; 35.475, -115.572).

**Project Description:** On March 29, 2024, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) executed a \$20,000,000 grant from Nature Based Solutions: Wildlife Corridors to the California Department of Transportation for the Project. The Project is designed to benefit terrestrial animals including desert bighorn sheep, mountain lion, and desert tortoise. The Project includes remediation of a barrier to wildlife connectivity presented by the existing I-15 highway and planned Brightline West railway line to be constructed within the I-15 corridor. Construction of dedicated wildlife overcrossings can effectively maintain and restore the ability of terrestrial wildlife to move across the existing highway lanes and a future highspeed railway in the median. Each wildlife overcrossing will be 100-feet in width. The span length of the overcrossings varies depending on the topography at each site - approximately 198 feet long at Cady and Clark Mountains and 186 feet long at Zzyzx Road Mountain. Each side of the overcrossing will feature a concrete barrier, topped by wire fencing, with directional fencing parallel to the I-15 corridor extending from the overcrossing surface to guide animals to the overcrossings.
