**Project Description**

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes an emergency culvert and slope repair on along southbound State Route 49 and 108 at various postmiles in Tuolumne County. Excessive rainfall runoff had overwhelmed the drainage facilities which causes flooding over the roadway and eroded slope. The project will replace the culverts and repair erosion damaged slope with rock slope protection (See Continuation Sheet for more scope of work). The purpose of the project is to address the damaged slope and overwhelmed culverts caused by heavy rainfall. The need of this project is to prevent and mitigate the loss or impairment of life, property, or essential public services.

The following work will be required at each location:

Location 1: TUO-State Route (SR) 49 Postmile (PM) 11.30

- Replace existing 12" corrugated steel pipe (CSP) and upsize to 18" reinforced concrete pipe (RCP)
- Rock slope protection (RSP) replenishment surrounding inlet and outlet (new material)
- Remove swale debris as needed

Location 2: TUO-49 PM 11.58

- Replace existing 12" CSP and place 12" RCP
- RSP surrounding inlet and outlet
- Remove debris from outlet as needed

Location 3: TUO-108 PM 52.1

- Replace existing 18" CSP and upsize to 24" CSP
- RSP replenishment surrounding inlet
- Remove rock/debris from inlet as needed

Location 4: TUO-108 PM 52.3

- Replace existing 18" CSP and upsize to 24" CSP
- RSP replenishment surrounding inlet/outlet

Location 5: TUO-108 PM 53.1

- Replace existing 18" CSP and upsize to 24" CSP
- RSP replenishment surrounding inlet/outlet
- Reset existing RSP in existing built swale

Location 6: TUO-108 PM 11.8

- RSP to repair failed slope up to AC dike

Location 7: TUO-108 PM 52.2

- RSP to repair failed slope along Westbound SR 108

Location 8: TUO-108 PM 52.25

- RSP to repair failed slope along Westbound SR108

### **General:**

### Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
  1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
  2. Protect the discovery area
  3. Notify the Engineer
  4. The Department Investigates.
    - Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
  
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.
