Proposed improvements include a non-motorized, user activated flash beacon system, pavement markings and road signs for "Share The Road" & "Bicycles And Pedestrians".

The following measures would be incorporated into the project to protect Biological Resources:

- *Species Protection for Migratory Birds (entire project limits)*
  1. Construct outside the nesting season (February 1-August 31, or:
  2. Pre-construction survey by an approved contractor supplied Biologist to identify bird nesting locations, if any.

Minor hazardous waste issues on the project will be addressed with Caltrans Standard Special Provisions and include:

- Aerially Deposited Lead (ADL) which is commonly found in all highway shoulders, may be in concentrations that require a special handling of excess materials. Based on the minimal ground disturbance with this project SPP 7-1.02K(g)(j)(iii) UNREGULATED EARTH MATERIAL CONTAINING LEAD will be required.
- A Lead Compliance Plan as a contract item will be required for soil disturbance and removal.
- Treated Wood Waste (TWW) may be generated from guardrail removal. This can be addressed with SSP 14-11.14 TREATED WOOD WASTE management in the construction contract and a TWW disposal item.
