Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

MINOR USE PERMIT - AT&T proposes to install a (N) wireless facility at 13225 Buffalo Road, Hesperia CA 92344 consisting of a (N) 117' Faux Water Tank Tower. Tower equipment to include (12) panel antennas, (36) RRUS and (6) DC9 surge suppressors inside faux water tank. (N) ground equipment to include (1) CWIC equipment shelter, (1) 20KW AC generator (w/ 140 gal total) diesel fuel tank, (1) GPS antenna, power & telco panels. Power, telco and fiber/coax runs of approximately 300 linear feet in underground conduit. All equipment to be enclosed within a 52' x 26' leasing area within a (N) 10' CMU wall.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The proposed Project has the potential to directly or indirectly impact nesting birds if construction activities occur during the nesting season (February 1 through September 30); however, compliance with Mitigation Measure BIO-1, in accordance with the requirements of the MBTA, would ensure that the proposed Project activities would not result in potentially significant impacts on nesting birds. The Project would be consistent with regional plans and programs that address environmental factors, such as air quality, energy, greenhouse gases, hydrology and water quality, transportation, utilities, and other applicable regulations that have been adopted by public agencies. Additionally, in many cases, including aesthetics, agriculture, biological resources, cultural resources, geology, hazards, land use, mineral resources, noise, public services and recreation, tribal cultural resources, and wildfire, the impacts associated with the Project are either localized to the Project site or are of such a negligible degree that they would not result in a considerable contribution to any significant cumulative impacts. Any potential impacts to Biological, Cultural, Geological, and Tribal Cultural Resources can be mitigated to a less than significant level with proposed mitigation included in the MND.

If applicable, describe any of the project's areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency, including issues raised by agencies and the public.

Public opposition has not been received regarding this proposal. The public has been notified of the availability of the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration, and given the opportunity to comment.
