Purpose: The purpose of the project is to preserve and extend the pavement service life of existing pavement in fair and poor condition. Additionally, extend the life of drainage systems rated as either fair or poor condition. Improve the traffic operations of the HOV lanes on SR 99 by including limited access striping between US 50 and Fruitridge in the SB direction. Improve safety and bring ancillary features to current design standards and ensure curb ramps meet current accessibility standards.

Need:

A total of 19.36 lane miles of existing flexible pavement (73%) is projected to be in fair condition by construction year 2026 and is expected to further deteriorate in the absence of proper action. The PaveM Survey Report projects that the existing pavement will be exhibiting a lane weighted average of 10.34% alligator B cracking for flexible pavement by construction year 2026.

Operational problems occur between US 50 and Fruitridge Rd. This 2-mile section experiences heavy congestion from about 3:30 PM to 6:30 PM. This is due to a lane drop at Fruitridge Rd that is only partially mitigated by a relatively large volume that exits at Fruitridge Rd. In the PM peak, there is also recurring congestion caused by merging from the US 50 and Broadway on-ramps. This congestion extends back to affect the southern end of SR 51. Mitigating this deficiency involves restricting lane changes between the genera purpose lanes and HOV lane on SR 99 in the SB direction between US 50 and Fruitridge Rd with additional signs and striping.

Culvert assessment indicates that multiple culverts are in fair or poor condition, which jeopardize the stability of the existing roadbed. Drainage systems in fair or poor conditions require rehabilitation or replacement to restore functionality.

Additionally, the existing areas beyond the gore in multiple locations are in poor condition and areas for MVPs are either non-existent and/or do not provide adequate parking and/or ingress/egress.

Furthermore, the existing concrete barriers, guardrails, TMS elements, and signs are in poor condition or nonstandard. The project area has curb ramps that are not ADA compliant.

Staging: All staging would occur within the Caltrans right-of-way on existing pullouts, or within areas of local jurisdictions where encroachment permits will be obtained.



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Disposal/Borrow: No borrow is required. There will be earthwork from ditch excavation that will be disposed of appropriately by the contractor.

Right-of-Way (ROW): There are locations at the southwest intersection of the 12th Ave/30th Street with ADA upgrade and drainage work outside Caltrans' ROW. Caltrans will obtain encroachment permits from local agencies to conduct that work. Encroachment Permits are required due to the relocation of luminaires and ADA curb ramps work on the city streets. Drainage work for this project will require several permanent drainage easements for CIPP liner works. Temporary construction easements will be required for this project.

Consultation/Coordination: No consultation/coordination are needed.

Permits: No permits are required.
