PROJECT TITLE: Lloyd Project (Categorical Exemption CE 23-44)

COUNTY: Lake

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT: Installation of an 80' long x 3' high retaining wall to support an existing 2' high wall.

A) Construction Equipment:

1. Trucks
2. Pontoon Boats/Trailers
3. Steel Barge
4. Crawler Crane
5. Generator /Welders
6. Transport Trailer

B) Equipment Details

1. 1999 Dodge 3500 Flat Bed/2003 Chevrolet 2500/2008 Ford 3500/2000 Chevrolet 1500.
2. (2) Kayat 8'W x 28'L Pontoons and trailers & (1) Crest-liner 8'W x 16'L Pontoon and trailer.
3. 20'W x 30'L Steel Barge
4. Link Belt 78, 30Ton Lattice 50' Boom Crawler Crane with 30' sleeve and 2000lbs drop hammer.
5. Bobcat 260 Welder Generator
6. 8'W x 35'L 4Ton transport trailer

C) Equipment Use

1. A 1999 Dodge truck is used to transport any waste material removed from job sites. A 2008 Ford and a 2003 Chevrolet truck will be used to tow pontoon boats in and out of the lake and to haul transport trailers with materials. The 2000 Chevrolet will be used to haul the Crest-liner pontoon.

2. The 28'L pontoons are used to get workers to the jobsite, along with all needed small materials and hand tools. The 16'L pontoon is used to tow the steel barge from the loading location to the job site.
 3. The steel barge carries the crane and is used to load all heavy materials and provides a staging area.
 4. The crane is tied down on the barge and is used to load and unload construction materials to and from the barge. The crane is also used with a sleeve and drop hammer to drive all needed pilings for the project and to set in place all prebuilt sections. (Examples: 16x16 deck, 3x24 gangway, 24x30 boat lift cradle and roof.)
 5. A welder is used to power hand tools and weld structures together.
 6. A transport trailer is used to haul pilings and heavy materials from storage to the barge.
- D) Construction Activities
1. All construction activities will be performed in the lake with the use of a pontoon boats and barge. No materials or construction equipment will have land access.
- E) Staging Area
1. All loading of materials and boat launching will take place at 9080 Soda Bay Rd. A barge will be used as the staging area before delivering structures to the project location
- F) Post Holes
1. No holes will be augered or dug. All pilings will be installed using a hammer to drive them directly in the lakebed.
- G) Ground Disturbance Plan
1. Six 10" pilings will be driven using a free fall hammer method. No digging, and no constant vibration or drilling will be used.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Section 15303, Class 3(e), the project is a new, small accessory structure, and pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Section 15302, this new structure will be located on

the same site as the structure to be supported and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure supported. No littoral vegetation will be removed. All work in the lake will take place between October 15 and December 31. The Lake County Community Development Department has determined that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment and is, therefore, exempt from the provisions of CEQA. The project will not result in significant adverse environmental effects to wetlands or riparian habitats.
