Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Overnight Solar Project (proposed project) is a proposal by Overnight Solar, LLC (project proponent) for the construction and operation of a photovoltaic (PV) solar facility and associated infrastructure necessary to generate 150 megawatts (MW) of renewable electrical energy with up to 150 MW of energy storage capacity (on approximately 596 acres). The proposed associated infrastructure includes laydown yards and a substation. PV panels, inverters, converters, foundations, and transformers will be installed onsite. The proposed project also includes a generation-tie (gen-tie) route to interconnect at the Southern California Edison's Kramer Junction Substation. The proposed project would require a major variance for the gen-tie and substation as the maximum allowable height is 52.5 feet. The gen-tie poles would be approximately 95 feet tall, and the substation would be approximately 65 feet tall at the highest point.

The Draft EIR (DEIR) identified potentially significant impacts for the following California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) issue areas (including cumulative impacts): biological resources, cultural resources, and geology and soils.

The DEIR includes mitigation measures that would sufficiently reduce impacts related to the issue areas listed above to a less than significant.

The DEIR determined that the Project would not result in any impacts that would remain significant and unavoidable after implementation of all feasible mitigation measures.
