Project Description:

The project site consists of an existing Medium Volume Construction Demolition/Inert Debris Processing Facility that receives less than 175 tons per operating day of construction, demolition, and inert (CDI) debris. The facility operates under a Registration Permit pursuant to Title 14 §18104 and §17383.5, which requires the facility to undergo a review every five years. Based on the review, and receipt of a certification by the operator, the facility continues to operate consistent with existing permit and associated documents. Therefore, the proposed action is the reissuance of the facility's Registration Permit. No changes to the existing operation are proposed, which includes the controlled separation, recovery, and recycling by manual and mechanical sorting of accepted CDI debris. Separated recyclables are segregated and stored in bins or roll-offs until ready for shipping to markets. Hours and days of CDI debris receipt continue to be Monday through Sunday, from 7:00am to 5:00pm and operating hours are Monday-Sunday 6:00am-8:00pm.
