PROJECT TITLE: Outer Bathroom Door and Door Jamb Replacement

LOCATION: Sutter's Fort State Historic Park

COUNTY: Sacramento

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:

This project will replace the public bathroom doors at Sutter's Fort State Historic Park to allow for the continued use of the restrooms for visitor and staff use. The existing doors and jambs are failing due to routine use as well as lack of strength at all connections. Work will:

- Remove existing non-historic failing door;
- Remove 2-in. of the existing non-historic door jamb and replace in kind;
- Fabricate new doors to fit existing openings; new door construction will use white oak for consistency with grain oriented for optimum strength and durability;
- Drill 8-in. deep holes into new jamb and adobe brick;
- Use epoxy to attach steel fasteners to new jambs and adobe brick;
- Use commercial grade hinges to hang the new doors, and
- Reinstall existing ADA-compliant closers, push bars, handles and signage.

All work will be done in accordance with the Secretary of Interior Standards for Rehabilitation of Historic Structures.

The project consists of the operation, maintenance or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond current levels; replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced; and consists of the maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of historic resources, in a manner consistent with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties, with Guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, Restoring and Reconstructing Historic Buildings (1995), Weeks and Grimmer.
