DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Project consists of the removal of artificial features and invasive species in the Pescadero North Marsh and Pond area of Pescadero Marsh Natural Preserve to restore ecologic, geomorphic, and hydraulic processes. Project work will partially remove a levee, ditch, and culvert system, construct wooden habitat structures, and perform vegetation management. Associated work is as follows:

- To support geomorphic and hydraulic processes between the Pescadero North Marsh and Pond and Pescadero Creek:
 - Use sheet piles and/or fillable bladder dams to dewater drainage ditches and main drainage channels;
 - o In conjunction with the dewatering, fish will be rescued and relocated;
 - o If needed, excavate or mechanically breach the sand berm to manage the lagoon's water levels:
 - Use excavators and scrapers to lower levees, remove drainage ditches and culverts, naturalize topography, and restore passive hydraulic processes; and
 - Construct habitat structures and place fill in drainage channels and ditches.
- To construct up to 38 wooden habitat supporting structures:
 - o Install 13 Buried Log Weirs throughout main drainage channels;
 - o Install Aquatic Habitat Structures in unfilled, remnant drainage channels;
 - o Install 11 Marshplain Habitat Structures along north marsh marshplain; and
 - Install up to 7 Topple Tree Habitat Structures in Pescadero Creek.
- For vegetation management:
 - o Remove ice plant, European dune grass, and Eucalyptus trees; and
 - Use native seed collected on site to revegetate work areas.
