Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

A request by Neil and Kimberly Wiser for a major grading permit (GRAD2022-00082) to allow for the construction of a pool, spa, and patio. The proposed project will disturb approximately 12,000 square-feet of the 39.33-acre parcel, including 60-cubic-yards of cut and 312-cubic-yards of fill. The proposed parcel is within the Rural Lands land use category and is located approximately 1.5 miles west of the Templeton Urban Reserve Line. The site is within the Adelaida Sub-area of the North County Planning Area.
