Project Location (include county): The Ash Hill Communication Site Project (Project) is located within federal land administered by the Bureau of Land Management within the Mojave Desert, San Bernardino (See Figure 1). The Project is located south of Interstate 40 (I-40), northeast of National Trails Highway (U.S. Route 66) and north of the east-west—oriented Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) railroad (Figure 1). Project access will occur along 5.77 miles of existing, unpaved BLM-designated open access routes (BLM Routes NS0017 and NS0003), starting from U.S. Route 66 and crossing under the BNSF railroad, with the final segment terminating at the tower site.

Project Description: The Project includes the development of 0.41 acres of Mojave creosote scrub habitat and use of 8.52 acres of developed or maintained areas to construct, operate and maintain, and decommission a multi-carrier communication site and ancillary components, and use of existing BLM access roads.

The Project will result in impacts to 0.41 acres of desert tortoise (*Gopherus agassizii*) habitat. The project is expected to result in incidental take of desert tortoise which is designated as a threatened/candidate species under the California Endangered Species Act. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation.
