Statement of reasons why project is exempt: Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) is applicable to the proposed project because the existing retaining wall would be replaced with in-kind timber of approximately 90 feet of total wall length within an existing park facility (Louis A. Stelzer County Park), involving no expansion of former use.
