Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The project will include five (5) individual small excavations, each approximately 6-feet by 8-feet, on Hopyard Road in Pleasanton. These test stations will allow Zone 7 to monitor corrosion over the pipeline to help determine when and where future repairs are needed. Work at each location will take approximately one week to complete. Traffic control will be provided during construction. Trench plating will be installed at the end of each work day. The completed excavation will be paved to match the existing street.
