


Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Activity / Project: This project will enhance vehicular circulation and pedestrian safety by creating a "No Parking" restriction on Avenue 408, east of Road 124, for the Villa de Guadalupe Apartment complex located there. Project will consist of installing "No Parking" signs along with painting the curb red as described, in the unincorporated community of Cutler, CA.

In response to concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety from vehicles parked at the crosswalk and creating a visibility obstruction, the Tulare County Resource Management Agency (RMA) investigated these concerns and determined that a "No Parking" restriction would enhance vehicular circulation and pedestrian safety by removing this obstruction.
