To repair the damage to these facilities, emergency work including shoulder work, gabion replacement/repair, conduit and associated infrastructure installation, and drainage system repairs were completed.

Water courses were graded to remove deposited material and to restore hydraulic function. Clogged or buried culverts were cleared, and rock slope protection was replaced Flood debris was removed from the roadway, dirt shoulders and side slopes. Damaged pavement was removed and replaced. Damaged roadway embankments were reestablished, and erosion gullies were filled. Eroded dirt shoulders were graded to reestablish roadside geometry. Earthen berms were reconstructed using excavated flood debris and surrounding material within the Caltrans RW. Damaged culverts and drainage appurtenances including headwalls, wingwalls, paved aprons, and rock slope protection were repaired or reconstructed. Pavement was restriped and damaged guardrail sections were repaired. Roadside signs and delineators were replaced.

Climate resiliency improvements were installed at select locations where extreme weather events have repeatedly damaged drainage systems. Improvements include gabion cages filled with rock, concrete cut-off walls, and rock slope protection.

Native material deposited by the flooding event was used to reconstruct embankments, reducing potential for importation of invasive species.

Staging Areas: All staging areas and staging activities (equipment storage, refueling, vehicle maintenance, stockpiles, etc.) were located over 100' from any jurisdictional resource.
