COMSTOCK ROAD AND FINE ROAD RESURFACING

Project Description

Project Location:

Comstock Road: Clements Road to Fine Road; **Fine Road:** Highway 26 to Comstock Road. **See attached Vicinity Map.**

Project Justification:

Comstock Road and Fine Road are two-lane roadways, each measuring 24-feet in width. Both roads were originally constructed in 1965 with 0.17-foot of Plant Mix Surfacing over 0.5-foot Aggregate Base (AB). Comstock Road (0.5 Mile west of Duncan Rd to Wall Road) was resurfaced (0.25-foot Asphalt Concrete (AC)) in 1998, and both Comstock and Fine Roads (from Wall Road to Highway 26) were resurfaced (0.25-foot AC) in 2000. Both roads have undergone cyclical maintenance through periodic chip seals, with the latest application occurring in 2017. Crack seal treatment has also been applied to Comstock Road.

Within the specified project limits, the prevailing condition of the pavement surface is characterized by transverse, block, and alligator cracking, with moderate rutting in the wheel paths. Furthermore, the pavement consists of sections of pavement failure, with temporary repair patches applied throughout the project limits.

Scope of Work:

The project will consist of:

- 1. Resurfacing existing roadway with 0.25' Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) (Type A).
- 2. Constructing tapered HMA edges to protect the edge of pavement.
- 3. Replenishing the existing graveled shoulders with 6-foot-wide shoulder backing, comprising 2' at an 8% slope and 4' designed to conform.
- 4. Repairing all pavement structural failure areas with full depth 0.50' HMA (Type A).
- 5. Applying Penetration Treatment at all intersection radii plus 50' or to conform.
- 6. Constructing HMA (Type A) driveways.
- 7. Placing one (1) new survey monument frame and cover.
- 8. Adjusting three (3) existing survey monument frames and covers to finish grade.


Environmental Setting:

In these portions of the San Joaquin County, land usage is primarily rural with single family homes.

There are many large trees adjacent to the project area. Nesting and migratory birds, protected by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, may nest within these trees. Furthermore, the Swainson's Hawk, a raptor species of concern within the State of California and listed as threatened may nest adjacent to or within the project area. A pre-construction survey for nesting Swainson's Hawks and other migratory birds is recommended if construction is scheduled to occur from February 15th to September 1st.


Beneficiaries:

NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

- The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
