Project Title: Wonderfront Music & Arts Festival

Project Location - Specific: Embarcadero Marina Park North (EMPN) (including parking lot); Ruocco Park (including parking lots); Seaport Village (including parking lots); Fifth Avenue Landing parking lot; and, The Headquarters

Project location - City: San Diego Project Location - County: San Diego

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: Wonderfront Holdings, LLC, as the Project Applicant (Applicant), proposes a three-day music and arts festival event, referred to as the "Wonderfront Festival" (Festival). The inaugural event was held in November 2019, and a subsequent event was held in November 2022. The Festival took place over a total of 11 days: three consecutive event days on the weekend (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday), and eight days for load-in and load-out. The Board of Port Commissioners (BPC) authorized the issuance of the first Coastal Development Permit (CDP) in 2019 (Clerk's Document No. 70574). Due to substantial changes proposed for the 2022 Festival, the BPC authorized the issuance of a new CDP in 2022 (Clerk's Document No. 74300). The Festival was determined to be Categorically Exempt to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines and the District's Guidelines for Compliance with CEQA.

For 2024, the Festival would be moved from its mid-November timeframe to May, and the duration of the Festival would remain unchanged (11 days total). In addition, the number of stages will increase from a maximum of six to seven stages, but the Festival footprint would be further reduced by eliminating Port Pavilion and Broadway Pier. The Festival would employ a hybrid approach to ensure the general public would be able to enjoy the Festival for free - there would be up to two free community stages at Seaport Village and the Applicant would also distribute free tickets to underserved communities. Additionally, District staff proposes to refine and continue to improve the Sound Monitoring Program requirements to ensure sound annoyance during the Festival is further minimized. The proposed CDP amendment is found to be Categorically Exempt pursuant to CEQA because the Festival is temporary in nature, and none of the proposed changes would result in any permanent effects on the environment.

Reason Why Project is Exempt: The proposed project is determined to be Categorically Exempt pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Sections 15301 (Existing Facilities), 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land), 15311 (Accessory Structures), and 15323 (Normal Operations of Facilities for Public Gatherings) and Sections 3.a., 3.d.(6), and 3.i. of the District's Guidelines for Compliance with CEQA. The Festival consists of activities associated with a temporary event that would involve a negligible expansion of use beyond that previously existing and installation of temporary structures (e.g. stages). It would not involve the removal of mature, scenic trees, would not result in permanent effects on the environment, and would consist of the normal operations of existing facilities for public gatherings. Sections 3.a., 3.d. (6), and 3.i. of the District's Guidelines for Compliance with CEQA and Section 15323 of the CEQA Guidelines are as follows:

3.a. <u>Existing Facilities (SG § 15301) (Class 1)</u>: Includes operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing.

AND/OR

- 3.d. Minor Alterations to Land (SG § 15304) (Class 4): Includes minor alterations in the condition of land, water and/or vegetation not involving removal of mature, scenic trees, including, but not limited to:
 - (6) Minor temporary use of land having negligible or no permanent effects on the environment.

AND/OR

 Accessory Structures (SG § 15311) (Class 11): Includes construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to (appurtenant to) existing facilities.

AND/OR

Normal Operations of Facilities for Public Gatherings (SG §15323) (Class 23)

Consists of the normal operations of existing facilities for public gatherings for which the facilities were designed, where there is a past history of the facility being used for the same or similar kind of purpose. For the purposes of this section, "past history" shall mean that the same or similar kind of activity has been occurring for at least three years and that there is a reasonable expectation that the future occurrence of the activity would not represent a change in the operation of the facility. Facilities included within this exemption include, but are not limited to, racetracks, stadiums, convention centers, auditoriums, amphitheaters, planetariums, swimming pools, and amusement parks.

The District has determined none of the six exceptions to the use of a categorical exemption apply to this project (CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2). The project is located in a highly urbanized environment, and there are no sensitive resources located on the project site or surrounding areas. The project is temporary in nature and does not present a cumulative impact. There is not a reasonable probability that the project would have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances. No damage to scenic resources would occur and the project site is not listed as a hazardous waste site pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code. The project does involve use of the Headquarters for temporary back of house operations, but it would not result in a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
