Project Description: The proposed project involves replacing the existing 10,000-gallon metal residential water tank with a 5,000-gallon polyurethane tank and repairing the existing concrete pad underneath the tank prior to tank installation. In addition, the existing booster pump, pump motor, adjoining head tank, and all connecting piping would be replaced like-for-like.

This is to advise that the County of San Diego Director of Department of General Services has approved the above described project on **March 28, 2024** and found the project to be exempt from the CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt: Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) is applicable to the proposed project because it involves replacing an existing residential water tank at an existing structure associated with an existing park facility (Oakoasis County Preserve) involving negligible expansion of former use. Section 15302 (Replacement and Reconstruction) is also applicable to the proposed project because it involves replacing the existing 10,000-gallon metal residential water tank with a 5,000-gallon polyurethane tank that would be located on the same site as the metal residential water tank being replaced and would involve no expansion of capacity.

Additionally, the project would not impact environmental resources of hazardous or critical concern that are designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted by government agencies; does not contribute to cumulative environmental impact; would not have a significant impact on the environment due to unusual circumstances; does not damage scenic resources within a designated state scenic highway; is not on the list of Hazardous Waste and Substance Sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and does not cause adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
