SUBJECT: NOTICE OF PREPARATION (NOP) OF A DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (EIR) FOR THE KERN RIVER EASTRIDGE CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE (CCS) PROJECT BY CHEVRON U.S.A INC.

The Kern County Planning and Natural Resources Department as Lead Agency (per CEQA Guidelines Section 15062) has determined that preparation of an Environmental Impact Report (per CEQA Guidelines 15161) is necessary for the proposed project identified below. The Planning and Natural Resources Department solicits the views of interested parties as to the scope and content of the environmental information which is germane to an agency's statutory responsibilities in connection with the proposed project. When considering another permit or other approvals for the proposed project, an agency may need to use the Draft EIR prepared by our Department.

You are invited to view the NOP and submit written comments regarding the scope and content of the environmental information in connection with the proposed project should you wish to do so. Due to the limits mandated by State law, your response must be received by <u>May 3, 2024 at 5:00 p.m</u>. **PROJECT LOCATION:** The proposed project site is located within the administrative boundary of the Kern River Oilfield situated in the eastern area of the valley region of unincorporated Kern County. Additionally, it is situated east of the unincorporated community of Oildale, east of Manor Drive and James Road, with China Grade Loop and Round Mountain Road traversing through the southern end of the oilfield. Furthermore, the proposed project site is within Sections 24, 25, and 36 of Township 28 South,

Range 27 East; Sections 17, 19, 20, and 28-33 of Township 28 South, Range 28 East; Sections 3, 4, and 5 of Township 29 South, Range 28 East of the Mount Diablo Base and Meridian (MDBM).

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Kern River Eastridge CCS Project is a proposal by Chevron U.S.A. Inc. to construct and operate a CCS facility for permanent underground storage of up to 6.8 million tons of CO<sub>2</sub> under approximately 7,343 acres in the Kern River Oilfield in unincorporated Kern County. The proposed project would consist of the underground injection formation, approved by the EPA as the "area of review" where the CO<sub>2</sub> will be stored in an exempt saline aquifer, the land surface area overlying the AOR where limited uses will be permitted, approval of two (2) EPA Class VI UIC wells with two (2) CO<sub>2</sub> back-up injection well locations, two (2) pressure management wells, approximately ten (10) initial monitoring wells, abandonment of any existing oil wells as determined by the EPA permit, pipeline for the transportation of CO<sub>2</sub>, and the related infrastructure improvements for the capture and transport of CO<sub>2</sub> from one source: the infield Eastridge Cogeneration Plant.

Implementation of the proposed project includes the following requests from the Kern County Planning and Natural Resources Department:

- (a) General Plan Amendment No. 1, Map No. 103-4 to the Metropolitan Bakersfield General Plan to amend Map Code Designation from LI (Light Industrial) on approximately 39 acres to Service Industrial (SI);
- (b) Zone Classification Changes (ZCC), as follows:
  - 1. ZCC No. 94, Map No. 81
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 532 acres.
  - 2. ZCC No. 24, Map No. 81-36
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 200 acres.
  - 3. ZCC No. 8, Map No. 82
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 215 acres:
    - NR (5) (Natural Resources 5 acres) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 285 acres.
  - 4. ZCC No. 3, Map No. 103-3
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 435 acres;
  - 5. ZCC No. 1, Map No. 103-4
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 509 acres;
    - From LI (Light Industrial) to M-2 (Medium Industrial) on approximately 39 acres.
  - 6. ZCC No. 1, Map No. 103-5
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 633 acres.
- (c) Conditional Use Permit (CUP), as follows:
  - 1. CUP No. 52, Map No. 81 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 532 acres.
  - 2. CUP No. 6, Map No. 81-36 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 200 acres.


- 3. CUP No. 9, Map No. 82 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 4,995 acres.
- 4. CUP No. 1, Map No. 103-3 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 435 acres.
- 5. CUP No. 1, Map No. 103-4 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within both the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 509 acres and the M-2 (Medium Industrial) Zone District on approximately 39 acres.
- 6. CUP No. 2, Map No. 103-5 to allow for the construction and operation of a CCS facility within the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District on approximately 633 acres.

CCS has been determined to be a storage operation under the Kern County Zoning Ordinance, Section 19.08.085 and Section 19.06.020. Therefore, CCS in either existing formations or tanks is an allowed use with a CUP in the following districts:

- A District (Exclusive Agriculture)
- M-2 District (Medium Industrial)
- M-3 District (Heavy Industrial)

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# INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the Kern County Planning and Natural Resources Department (County) will initiate the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Kern River Eastridge Carbon Capture and Storage Project by Chevron U.S.A, Inc proposed in the unincorporated area the valley portion of Kern County, California near the metropolitan Bakersfield area.

# 1. Project Description

### 1.1. Project Location

The Kern River Eastridge Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) Project (proposed project) is a proposal by Chevron U.S.A. Inc. (project proponent) to construct and operate a Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) facility with surface land of approximately 7,343 acres on privately owned land. The proposed project would include an underground storage facility with the capacity to permanently store up to 6.8 million metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub>, up to four (4) EPA permitted Class VI CO<sub>2</sub> injection wells, two (2) pressure management wells, approximately ten (10) monitoring wells, and potentially the abandonment of oil wells. The source for CO<sub>2</sub> is the existing infield Eastridge Cogeneration Plant. A CO<sub>2</sub> capture facility and CO<sub>2</sub> pipeline will be constructed for capture and transport to the CCS underground storage facility.

The proposed project site is comprised of one-hundred and ten (110) privately owned parcels, and six (6) provisional parcels located within the administrative boundary of the Kern River Oilfield, where the land is primarily used for oil and gas exploration and production. The Kern River Oilfield is approximately 16,600 acres and is predominately located in an unincorporated portion of Kern County, with the southern portion of the oilfield located in the City of Bakersfield. The proposed project boundary will be solely within the jurisdiction of Kern County of unincorporated land. Additionally, it is located east of the unincorporated community of Oildale, east of Manor Drive and James Road, with China Grade Loop and Round Mountain Road traversing through the southern end of the oilfield.

The proposed project is located within Sections 24, 25, and 36 of Township 28 South, Range 27 East; Sections 17, 19, 20, and 28-33 of Township 28 South, Range 28 East; Sections 3, 4, and 5 of Township 29 South, Range 28 East of the Mount Diablo Base and Meridian (MDBM). The proposed project area can be seen in *Figure 1 – Regional Vicinity*.

Primary access to the proposed project site would be from China Grade Loop, which can be seen in  $Figure 2-Local\ Vicinity$ . The access road connects to a network of existing dirt roads within the field; depending on the final locations of the injection wells and accessory facilities and infrastructure, new internal access roads may be constructed. These new roads would most likely be compacted dirt roads.

### 1.2. Environmental Setting

The proposed project site is within an active oilfield that is situated in the eastern area of the valley region of unincorporated Kern County. The County's geography includes, among other features, mountainous area, agricultural lands, and deserts. Kern County is California's third largest County in land area and encompasses approximately 8,200 square miles with the current estimated population being 930,000 residents.

The proposed project will encompass approximately 7,343 acres of the Kern River Oilfield. The primary operator within the Kern River Oilfield is Chevron U.S.A. Inc. The Kern River Oilfield is predominantly

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developed with oil and gas production and accessory facilities and infrastructure, which includes their Eastridge Cogeneration Facility and Station 36 water treatment facility. The Eastridge Cogeneration Facility is comprised of two gas turbines that supply steam and electricity for the Kern River Oilfield operations and would be used for the electrical demand for the proposed project. The Station 36 water treatment facility would also be utilized for the treatment of produced water to be used for the proposed project.

The proposed project site is not designated by the California Department of Conservation (DOC) as Prime Farmland, Farmland of Statewide Importance, or Unique Farmland. The proposed project site is within the San Joaquin Valley Air Basin, under the regulatory authority of the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District. There is one (1) State-designated Alquist-Priolo Earthquake Fault Zone (Oildale) that traverses north-south on the western side of the proposed project site. Portions of the proposed project site are located within a Kern County-designated mineral recovery zone and the proposed project site is designated by the Kern County General Plan for Mineral and Petroleum exploration and extraction.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) delineates flood hazard areas on its Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs). The proposed project site is designated as Zone "X" on FIRMs, which indicates the site is outside of the 0.2% annual chance of flooding, as seen in *Figure 5 – Flood Hazard*. No portion of the proposed project site is identified as a wetland area on the National Wetlands Inventory. However, two (2) drainage courses that cross the proposed pipeline alignment are mapped as riverine features according to the National Wetlands Inventory mapping program maintained by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

As depicted in *Figure 10 - Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan Zones*, the proposed project site has four (4) parcels located within the Sphere of Influence (SOI) of the Meadows Field Airport with a portion of one (1) parcel (APN: 484-020-12) located within Zone C, per the Kern County Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP).

The proposed project site is within the boundaries of the Kern County General Plan (KCGP) and the Metropolitan Bakersfield General Plan. The proposed project is subject to the provisions of the Kern County Zoning Ordinance and spans across Zone Map 81, 81-36, 82, 103-3, 103-4, and 103-5.

The surrounding land use of the proposed project site includes oil and gas exploration and production, residential development, and agricultural lands. The sensitive receptor closest to the proposed project site is a residential development located approximately 300 feet of the proposed CCS Surface Land Area within

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the project boundary and approximately 3,550 from the nearest proposed CCS injection well. North Meadows Park is the nearest public recreational area located approximately 3,750 feet of the proposed project boundary and approximately 7,830 feet from the nearest proposed injection well. *Table 3: Schools near the Proposed Project Site*, below identifies the public and private educational institutions that are near the proposed project site.

Furthermore, the proposed project would be served by the Kern County Sheriff's Office (KCSO) for law enforcement and public safety, the Kern County Fire Department (KCFD) for fire protection, and the Kern County Medical Emergency Service for emergency medical and rescue services. The nearest KCSO substation that would serve the proposed project is located in the unincorporated community of Oildale at 1350 Norris Road. Additionally, fire protection and emergency medical service would be provided by the KCFD fire station (Station No. 63) located at 101 Universe Avenue. The nearest hospital is Bakersfield

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Memorial Hospital at 420 34<sup>th</sup> Street in the City of Bakersfield, which is approximately 2.5 miles from the proposed project boundary.

### 1.3. Project Description

Chevron U.S.A. Inc. is proposing to construct and operate a CCS facility for permanent underground storage of up to 6.8 million tons of CO<sub>2</sub> under approximately 7,343 acres in the Kern River Oilfield in unincorporated Kern County. The proposed project would consist of the underground injection formation, approved by the EPA as the "area of review" where the CO<sub>2</sub> will be stored in an exempt saline aquifer, CCS Surface Land Area over the underground storage area where limited uses will be permitted, approval of two (2) EPA Class VI UIC wells with two (2) CO<sub>2</sub> back-up injection well locations, two (2) pressure management wells, approximately ten (10) initial monitoring wells, abandonment of any existing oil wells as determined by the EPA permit, pipeline for the transportation of CO<sub>2</sub>, and the related infrastructure improvements for the capture and transport of CO<sub>2</sub> from one source: the infield Eastridge Cogeneration Plant.

Please see Figure 10 – Proposed Project CUP boundary for a visual representation of the CUP boundary and Figure 11 – Proposed Site Plan and Figure 12 – Proposed Site Plan (Sheet 2) for a conceptual layout of the proposed project's CCS facility.

It is estimated that the proposed project would capture up to 265,000 metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub> per year for a period of 20 years from the Eastridge Cogeneration Facility and stored in the Vedder formation, which is an exempt saline aquifer. Modeling conducted in accordance with UIC Class VI Program regulations has been performed to define the anticipated limits of the CCS field and submitted to the EPA for review and consideration for approval. Such modeling and delineation accounts for physical and chemical properties of all phases of the injected CO<sub>2</sub> stream and displaced fluids, and is based upon available site characterization, monitoring, and operational data consistent with UIC Class VI Program regulations. The modeling submitted demonstrates that the injection formation beneath the proposed project site has an estimated storage capacity of up to 6.8 million tons of CO<sub>2</sub>. The formation therefore has sufficient capacity to sequester the estimated CO<sub>2</sub> captured from the Eastridge Cogeneration Facility.

The applicant states that there is no current need to obtain and store an additional volume of CO<sub>2</sub>, either from Chevron U.S.A. Inc. or from other sources, and the proposed project is not dependent upon the identification of other future CO<sub>2</sub> sources.

The Eastridge Cogeneration Facility is comprised of two gas turbines that supply steam and electricity for the Kern Reiver Oilfield operations. In the proposed project, the cogeneration exhaust from the facility would be cooled using a cooling tower and/or air coolers, and then contacted with an amine-based solvent to absorb the CO<sub>2</sub>. The CO<sub>2</sub>-rich solvent would be heated and routed to a stripper which uses steam to remove the CO<sub>2</sub> from the solvent. The amine solvent would then be regenerated and recirculated back to the absorber. The CO<sub>2</sub> stream pressure would be increased through the use of compression equipment and the CO<sub>2</sub> would be dehydrated. The resulting CO<sub>2</sub> stream would be approximately 99.5% purity. The concentrated CO<sub>2</sub> would be subsequently transported by 6 to 8-inch diameter pipeline to the injection well locations within the Kern River Oilfield.

The CO<sub>2</sub> capture facilities would be constructed on a vacant 5.5 acre area east of the Eastridge Cogeneration Facility. Site preparation would require fill to level the proposed CO<sub>2</sub> capture facility site. The fill soil would be obtained from an on-site borrow source within the Kern River Oilfield. Some existing structures (including wells, and pipelines) may be modified because of the proposed project. As proposed by the



applicant, new permanent fencing would surround the capture facility. New signage and lighting would be minimal, and not visible from outside the Kern River Oilfield.

Implementation of the proposed project would also require permits from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in compliance with the Underground Injection Control (UIC) Program for Class VI injection wells (40 CFR 146.81 et seq.). The CO<sub>2</sub> would be injected into the subsurface Vedder formation for storage in perpetuity at a depth of approximately 4,000 to 6,000 feet below ground surface. Caprock overlying the Vedder formation would provide an impermeable seal to protect the shallow drinking water aquifer. The planned injection wells are located within the southwestern quadrant of the oilfield and within the proposed CUP boundary as are all the proposed monitoring wells. The injected CO<sub>2</sub> would migrate to the northeast and would remain within the injection zone. Any issued EPA permit will also identify any existing oil wells that require abandonment. Abandonment would be done under a permit from the California Department of Conservation Geologic Energy Management Division (CalGEM).

The proposed project's water demand would be met mostly using produced water and would utilize up to 1,300,000 gallons per day during the operational phase, which would be sourced from a combination of produced water and ground water pumped from water wells within the oilfield. The water would be utilized in the amine solvent absorption process, and for cooling tower make-up water (which replaces water lost through evaporation). The planned pressure management wells would be utilized to extract water from the injection zone. The produced water would be handled using existing facilities located within the Kern River Oilfield boundary.

Electrical demand for the proposed project is estimated to be approximately 8 Megawatts, which would be provided by the Eastridge Cogeneration Facility's existing capacity.

Implementation of the proposed project requires the following actions for public consideration processed by s the Kern County Planning and Natural Resources Department:

- (a) General Plan Amendment No. 1, Map No. 103-4 to the Metropolitan Bakersfield General Plan to amend Map Code Designation from LI (Light Industrial) on approximately 39 acres to Service Industrial (SI);
- (b) Zone Classification Changes (ZCC:
  - 1. ZCC No. 94, Map No. 81
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 532 acres.
  - 2. ZCC No. 24, Map No. 81-36
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 200 acres.
  - 3. ZCC No. 8, Map No. 82
    - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 215 acres;
    - NR (5) (Natural Resources 5 acres) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 285 acres.

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- 4. ZCC No. 3, Map No. 103-3
  - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 435 acres;
- 5. ZCC No. 1, Map No. 103-4
  - From A-1 (Limited Agriculture) to A (Exclusive Agriculture) on approximately 509 acres;
  - From LI (Light Industrial) to M-2 (Medium Industrial) on approximately 39 acres.

- M-3 District (Heavy Industrial)

## 1.4. Project Objectives

The project proponent defined the following objectives for the proposed project:

• Construct and operate facilities and infrastructure to capture, transport, inject, and permanently store the full amount of CO2 produced by the Chevron Eastridge Cogeneration in a safe, secure, and economically feasible manner;

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- Reduce the greenhouse emissions intensity of Chevron's existing cogeneration facility by capturing CO2 from an existing stationary source;
- Generate environmental, social, and economic benefits for Kern County and the State of California by implementing low carbon technologies, and developing CCS infrastructure in the region;
- Minimize new disturbance by siting project facilities within existing developed areas; and
- Contribute to California's goal to achieve carbon neutrality by 2045, while continuing to operate by integrating carbon capture into existing operations in Kern County.

## 1.5. Proposed Discretionary Actions/Required Approvals

The Kern County Planning and Natural Resources Department as the CEQA Lead Agency (per CEQA Guidelines Section 15052) has discretionary responsibility for the Kern River Eastridge CCS Project owned by Chevron U.S.A Inc. To implement this project, the project proponent may need to obtain discretionary and ministerial permits/approvals including, but not limited to, the following:

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



Figure 1 – Regional Vicinity



Figure 2 – Local Vicinity









Figure 3 – Agricultural Preserve

Figure 5 – Existing General Plan Designations






Figure 6 – Proposed General Plan Designations







Figure 10 – Proposed Project CUP Boundary



### Other Environmental Issues

The County conducted a preliminary review of the proposed Project and has determined it is not likely to result in significant environmental effects to the following resources. Therefore, further analysis is not warranted in the EIR.

• Agricultural and Forestry Resources: According to the California Department of Conservation (DOC), there are no agricultural lands designated Prime Farmland, Unique Farmland, or Farmland of Statewide Importance located within the proposed project site. There are also no active farmlands located in the proposed project's vicinity. Therefore, construction and/or operation of the proposed project would not result in the conversion of designated Farmland to a nonagricultural use.

Additionally, the proposed project site does not contain lands that are subject to a land use contract under the Williamson Act. The proposed project site is primarily being changed to the A (Exclusive Agriculture) Zone District, except for one (1) parcel that will be changed to the M-2 (Medium Industrial) Zone District. However, CCS is considered a compatible use within these zone classification with a CUP, and no active agricultural lands would be affected by the proposed project. As such, there would be no impacts to Williamson Act lands and lands zoned for agricultural use.



The proposed project site is not situated on forest or timberland with areas that are currently under production. There is no land in the vicinity of the proposed project site that is zoned as forest land, timberland, or lands zoned for timberland production. Therefore, there would be no impacts related to the rezoning of forest land, timberland, or timberland zoned for timberland production.

Furthermore, the proposed project would not have indirect impacts to the existing environment that would affect agricultural and forestry resources and does not require further evaluation in the EIR.
