Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Corral Creek watershed, approximately 6.92 miles northeast of the town of Hayfork, County of Trinity, State of California. The project is located in Section 27, T4N, R7E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Big Bar U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 011-120-014; latitude 40.69780 N and longitude 123.36543W at the point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number EPIMS-TRI-46737-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mrs. Joyce Henshaw Plath.

The project is limited to 2 encroachments. One encroachment is for water diversion from Corral Creek. Water is diverted to hydrologically connected off stream pond, but stored water is not used for domestic use and irrigation. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure in compliance with this Agreement. The other encroachment is to decommission an existing unpermitted bridge. Work for this project includes decommissioning of the bridge by removal of log spanners and decking.
