#### Additional work

In 2021, the Dixie Fire burned a total of 963,309 acres in Butte, Plumas, Shasta, Lassen, and Tehama Counties. Since the fire, soil has become unstable, and landslides and debris flows have been observed within the burn scar.

Inclement weather throughout early 2023 resulted in additional slides and the need for drainage/culvert repairs. As a result, SR 70 was affected in several locations in Butte and Plumas Counties. The main landslide occurred at PLU-70-PM 22.7, depositing approximately 20,000 cubic yards (CY) of material onto the roadway. Supplemental Director's Orders have been approved to repair damage caused by an additional 6 major slides (Table 1.), plus smaller minor slides, and repairs and/or cleaning out of 28 drainages that were damaged and/or plugged in the storms and resulting slides.

Rockslide, debris flow, and landslide material have been removed, and culverts/drainages have been replaced as needed throughout the project limits.

PLU-70-PM 15.2	This area showed signs of potential failure in the first week of January 2023. Field maintenance made note of large earthen cracks forming on the hillside and small amounts of rockfall deposited on the roadway at that time. Since then, 5 separate slide events occurred at this location resulting in over 80,000 CY of material being deposited on the roadway.
PLU-70-PM 0.0	Multiple slides happened at this location with over 1,500 CY of material, including large granite boulders, landing on the roadway.
PLU-70-PM 25.4	This area slid twice, and maintenance needed the hired contractor's help to manage the material.
PLU-70-PM 12.38	Field maintenance workers stored slide material in turnouts until a permanent disposal location was determined.
BUT-70-PM 44.39	Flooding at this location caused erosion on the downhill slope from the roadway and near the parking lot of the Crest Dam PG&E Power House. Slide material was removed, and roadside drainage was repaired.
BUT-70-PM 42.68	A down drain separated during the slide at this location and approximately 300 CY of material was deposited on the roadway.

Project work included: clearing the slide material off the traveled way, providing 24 hour traffic control, replacement of damaged asphalt concrete surfacing and pavement markings, replacement of damaged culverts, hauling off slide material to approved disposal sites, and replacement of damaged guardrail and signs.

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**Purpose:** The purpose of this project was to remove hazards, replace damaged assets, and repair facilities to Caltrans standards in order to restore public safety.

**Need:** The project was needed because landslides prohibited travel for the public and damaged Caltrans assets.

#### Right-of-Way

Acquisitions or TCEs were not needed for this project due to work being confined to Caltrans ROW.

#### Staging/Stockpiling

Staging and stockpiling took place on paved or graveled pullouts within the construction zone, within Caltrans right of way.

#### **Disposal/Borrow Sites**

No borrow sites were needed.

Material was disposed of at several locations, including privately-owned land at PLU-70-PM 27.3, and publicly-owned land at PLU-70-PM 9.04, BUT-70-PM 35.5, and PLU-70-PM 31.8.

#### Coordination/Consultation

To identify potential cultural resources, Caltrans staff conducted a review of internal and external agency resource records and databases. Additionally, a visual review of the project area was completed by cultural staff. Once review was completed it was determined emergency work had no potential to affect cultural resources.

#### **Permits**

Caltrans submitted a notification of emergency repair work to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) which led to the issuance of a 1610 permit.
