Project Description (including purpose and beneficia	aries of project)		
The Vessel Inspection Program for Zebra and Quagga Mussel Inspection is operated by the County of Santa Clara Parks and Recreation Department at various County-operated facilities to assist with coordinated Bay Area efforts to prevent the introduction of dreissenid mussels into local waterways. Invasive mussels spread easily by attaching themselves to boats, personal watercraft, and related equipment while also posing a serious threat to water quality and water supply infrastructure. Agencies participating in the Bay Area Regional Consortium Zebra and Quagga Mussel Coordinated Prevention Plan (Prevention Plan) agree to implement the vessel inspection and reservoir monitoring guidelines and procedures identified in the Prevention Plan.			
Authority to operate a Vessel Inspection Program for Zebra and Quagga Mussel Inspection was signed into law in October 2007 as a result of the passage of Assembly Bill (AB) 1683. AB 1683 authorized the Department of Fish & Gam to inspect and quarantine infected boats, close recreational facilities, and restrict access to certain lakes. AB 1683 also gave local water operators an option to control their own waterways by implementing a dreissenid mussel monitoring and prevention program.			
Inspection stations are operated at the following Santa Clara County reservoirs: Calero, Coyote, Lexington, and Stevens Creek. Each inspection station consists of one 8'x20' converted metal shipping container on existing pavement distance appropriately from the boat launch area, as defined by the best management practices of the <i>Prevention Plan</i> . Electricity connected to each station except Stevens Creek. Power will be established at Stevens Creek inspection station by			

Implementation of the Vessel Inspection Program includes physical inspection by trained staff and/or canines of all vessels intending to launch at a County-operated boating facility. Vessels that are wet-and-dry fail inspection and are not permitted to launch. Vessels that have boated on a non-permissible water body are quarantined for 30 days and are not permitted to launch. Vessels that originate from a banned area are turned around at the park entrance or kiosk and never sent to the Vessel Inspection Station. Operation of the Vessel Inspection Program corresponds to the hours/days of operation of boating on the reservoir. Hours/days of operation vary seasonally.

performing trenching through existing parking lot and connecting to existing PG&E lines. When necessary, portable restrooms are placed in the inspection station vicinity. Inspection program signage is posted on facility structures (i.e., vessel inspection stations, park kiosks, existing sign posts, or launch ramp gates) in addition to portable signs directing boaters to stations. Clean, Drain, and Dry (CD3) machines may be set up at Calero and Coyote reservoirs which assist
