

NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

Within 30 days after the end of each month in which the environmental filing fees are collected, each county shall summarize and record the amount collected on the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31) and remit the amount collected to the State Treasurer. Identify the remittance on Form No. CA25 as "Environmental Document Filing Fees" per Fish and Game Code section 711.4.

The county clerk shall mail the following documents to CDFW on a monthly basis:

- ✓ A photocopy of the monthly State of California Form No. CA25 (TC31)
- ✓ CDFW/ASB copies of all cash receipts (including all voided receipts)
- ✓ A copy of all CDFW No Effect Determinations filed in lieu of fee payment.
- A copy of all NODs filed with the county during the preceding month
- A list of the name, address and telephone number of all project applicants for which an NOD has been filed. If this information is contained on the cash receipt filed with CDFW under California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 753.5, subdivision (e)(6), no additional information is required.

DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months.

RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- # The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001. If a county issued 252 receipts for the year ending on December 31, the last receipt number should end in 252. CDFW recommends that counties and state agencies 1) save a local copy of this form, and 2) track receipt numbers on a spreadsheet tabbed by month to ensure accuracy.

Beltz 10 was never fully and properly developed after well construction due to limitations that existed at that time for the disposal of well development water. That situation has since been resolved and the City now seeks to maximize the production capacity of the well through a rigorous well rehabilitation/well development program. Reasons why project is exempt:

This project is exempt under California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines §15301 - Existing Facilities, for routine maintenance activities that do not result in a serious or major disturbance of an environmental resource.

Additionally, the project is not barred by the exceptions for taking a Class 1 Categorical Exemption (14 Cal Code Regs §15300.2):

- (a) Location. Not applicable for Class 1 Exemptions
- (b) Cumulative Impact. The 2024 well rehabilitation project would not result in a cumulative impact of successive projects overtime because this project is fully contained within the facility footprints and construction activities would be temporary and isolated.
- (c) Significant Effect.
 - There will be no significant impacts from noise to adjacent properties with ASR testing. Noise from all activities will comply with the Santa Cruz County noise ordinance.
 - No permanent impacts to sensitive, scenic, or coastal resources would occur. Discharges will meet NPDES requirements.
- (d) Scenic Highways. The study would not damage scenic resources within a scenic highway. The site is not near or within the viewshed of a designated scenic highway.
- (e) Hazardous Waste Sites. The study site is not located on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code (Cortese List).
- (f) Historical Resources. The study is not anticipated to cause an adverse change to a historical resource. There are no known cultural or historic resources in the area and no structures would be affected.
