This is to advise that the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors has approved the above- described project on **May 22, 2024 (Item #2)** and found the project to be exempt from the CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt:

Acceptance of the 2023 Multiple Species Conservation Program South County Subarea Plan Annual Report is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(b)(5) of the State CEQA Guidelines. The action before the Board of Supervisors is to receive the 2023 Multiple Species Conservation Program South County Subarea Plan Annual Report, which is a governmental administrative activity. Therefore, the action is not a project as defined by Section 15378(b)(5) of the State CEQA Guidelines. Additionally, the action to receive the 2023 Multiple Species Conservation Program South County Plan Annual Report is covered by the commonsense exemption which states that CEQA only applies to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. It can be seen with certainty that today's action will not result in a significant effect on the environment because it is administrative in nature.

Additionally, the project will not impact environmental resources of hazardous or critical concern that are designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted by government agencies; does not contribute to cumulative environmental impact; will not have a significant impact on the environment due to unusual circumstances; does not damage scenic resources within a designated state scenic highway; is not on the list of Hazardous Waste and Substance Sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code; and does not cause adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
