- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 stats that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County Coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98, if the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

### Hazardous Waste:

- The project requires removal of yellow paint/thermoplastic traffic striping and/pr
  pavement markings. If determined to be nonhazardous, the waste shall be managed as
  construction debris Caltrans Standards Special Provision (SSP) 36-4 shall be added to
  the contract.
- The Caltrans SSP 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii), pertaining to Earth Material Containing Lead, shall be added to the construction contract. A Lead Compliance Plan prepared by a Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) is required and all soil must remain on-site.
