On Interstate 8 in the City of La Mesa, County of San Diego, the proposed Director’s Order project would repair recent storm damage. Emergency repairs are required due to scour at the Alvarado Creek channel by replacing existing rock slope protection (RSP); repair damaged culverts; repair Alvarado Road (south of Alvarado Creek); repair north slope along Eastbound I-8 roadway lanes and off-ramp to Alvarado Road; and clean up debris from storm. See the ECR for environmental commitments. Any project changes will require additional Environmental analysis. No new right of way required.
