Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project includes a Tentative Tract Map No. 38266 to subdivide one existing parcel (APN: 685-100-009) into nine (9) residential lots and three (3) lettered lots, including a private street. The subject site is 5.04 gross acres and has the underlying zoning designation of Very Low Density Residential (R-L-2). The residential lot sizes range from 18,000 square feet to 20,840 square feet.

Biological Resources Mitigation No. 1. Pre-construction surveys for burrowing owls, desert tortoise, and nesting birds protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act and Section 3503 of the California Fish and Wildlife Code shall be conducted prior to the commencement of Project-related ground disturbance. Biological Resources Mitigation No. 2. A focused plant survey should be considered for all special status plant species that have the potential to occur on the site to be performed during the blooming season (April - June) to determine the potential environmental effects of the proposed projects on special status plants and sensitive natural communities following recommended protocols by the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Tribal Cultural Resources Mitigation Measures No. 1. The presence of an approved Agua Caliente Native American Cultural Resource Monitor(s) during any ground disturbing activities (including archaeological testing and surveys).
