Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Fire Station 7: The proposed fire station would be 7,883 square feet and 25 feet tall. The fire station would be located on the undeveloped parcel adjacent the existing Fire Station 7 and would replace the existing facility with a modern facility.

Fire Station 25: The proposed fire station would be 15,196 square feet and 30 feet tall. The existing Fire Station 25 would be demolished to allow for construction of the replacement fire station. During construction, the Castro Valley administration building and parking lot owned by the Castro Valley Sanitary District, located at 21040 Marshall Street, would be used as a temporary Fire Station 25 to maintain emergency fire service response.
