Project Title: Center Street Weir Repair (Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification No. SJN-41948-R2)

Project Location: The project is located at the Stockton Diverting Canal, in the County of San Joaquin, State of California; Latitude 37.95361, Longitude -121.29167 (WGS 84 datum, decimal degrees); Assessor's Parcel Number 137-010-07.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification Number SJN-41948-R2, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, City of Stockton Public Works as represented by Jessie Garcia.

The project is limited to the removal of the existing rip rap materials from the channel, the removal of a portion of an existing concrete seawall, the installation of 47 lineal feet of steel sheet pile, the backfilling of the sheet piling with reinforced concrete, the replacement of the removed seawall, and the replacement for the removed rip rap.

Person or Public Agency Carrying out Project: City of Stockton Public Works

Exempt Status:

Categorical Exemption. Type – Class (1, 2 & 4); California Code of Regulations, title 14, sections (15301, 15302 & 15304)

Reasons why project is exempt: The project is exempt under section 15301 because it involves the minor alteration and repair of existing public or private facilities. The project is exempt under 15302 because it involves the replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same sites as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced. The project is exempt under section 15304 because it involves minor alteration to land that does not involve the removal of healthy, mature, or scenic trees.
