The California Department of Transportation issued a District Director's Order to complete pavement damage repairs in ED County on interstate 50 from PM 42.00 to 63.80. The scope of work includes hazard tree/debris removal; rockfall mitigation; replace/clean culverts, catch basins, ditches, debris racks; replace guardrail, pavement, delineation; traffic control; erosion control; and incidental work. It is in the best interest of the estate to perform Permanent Restoration (PR) repairs through an EFA contact.

Section 14-9.02 specifically requires compliance by the contractor with all applicable laws and regulations related to air quality, including the El Dorado County Air Quality Management District regulations and local ordinances.

All staging occurred within Caltrans Right-of-Way.

Based on the scope of work, there was no disposal that required a borrow site.
